

# COVID19 Vaccination Report

## Manitoba First Nations Pandemic Response Coordination Team



There is now an infant COVID-19 vaccine available for children aged 6 months to 4 years in each community.  
 First Nations people age 45 and older are eligible for a Spring COVID-19 booster vaccination.

### Date: August 4, 2023

The information describes First Nations vaccines that have been recorded in PHIMS as of August 4, 2023. Since many communities do not have access to PHIMS directly we know many more doses have been administered in the communities but have not yet been recorded in PHIMS. We continue to work to address the delay so that the numbers we report more accurately reflect the excellent work going on in communities.

### Total Doses Administered

Total number of vaccinations: **333,091**

- 3356 First Nations received 5 doses
- 12,954 First Nations received 4 doses
- 45,614 First Nations received 3 doses
- 129,215 First Nations people received 2 doses
- 141,935 First Nations people received 1 dose

### Doses by Vaccine Type:

- COVID 19: Moderna vaccination: **179,211**
- COVID 19: Pfizer vaccination: **150,837**
- COVID-19: AstraZeneca: **2942**
- COVID-19: Janssen: **88**

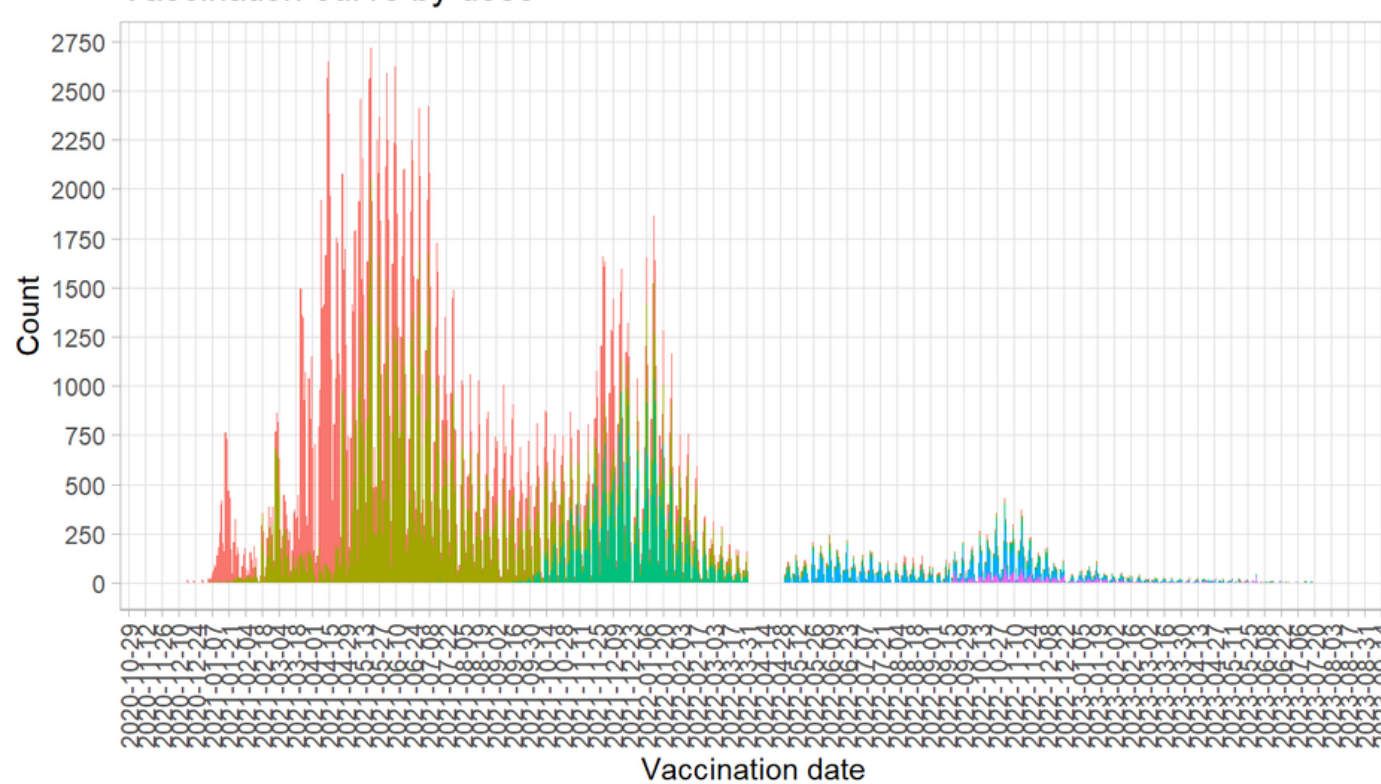

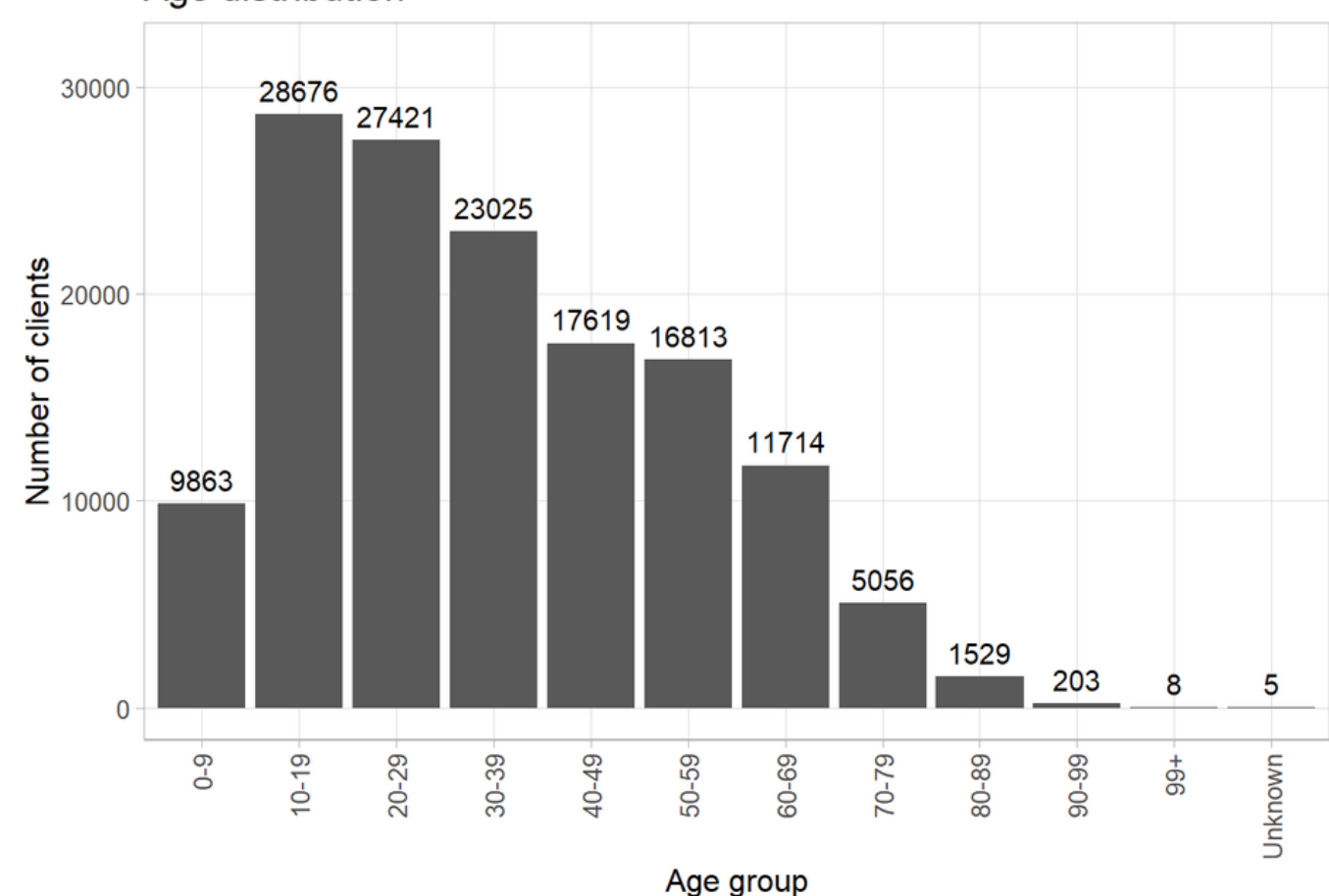
### Distribution- sex



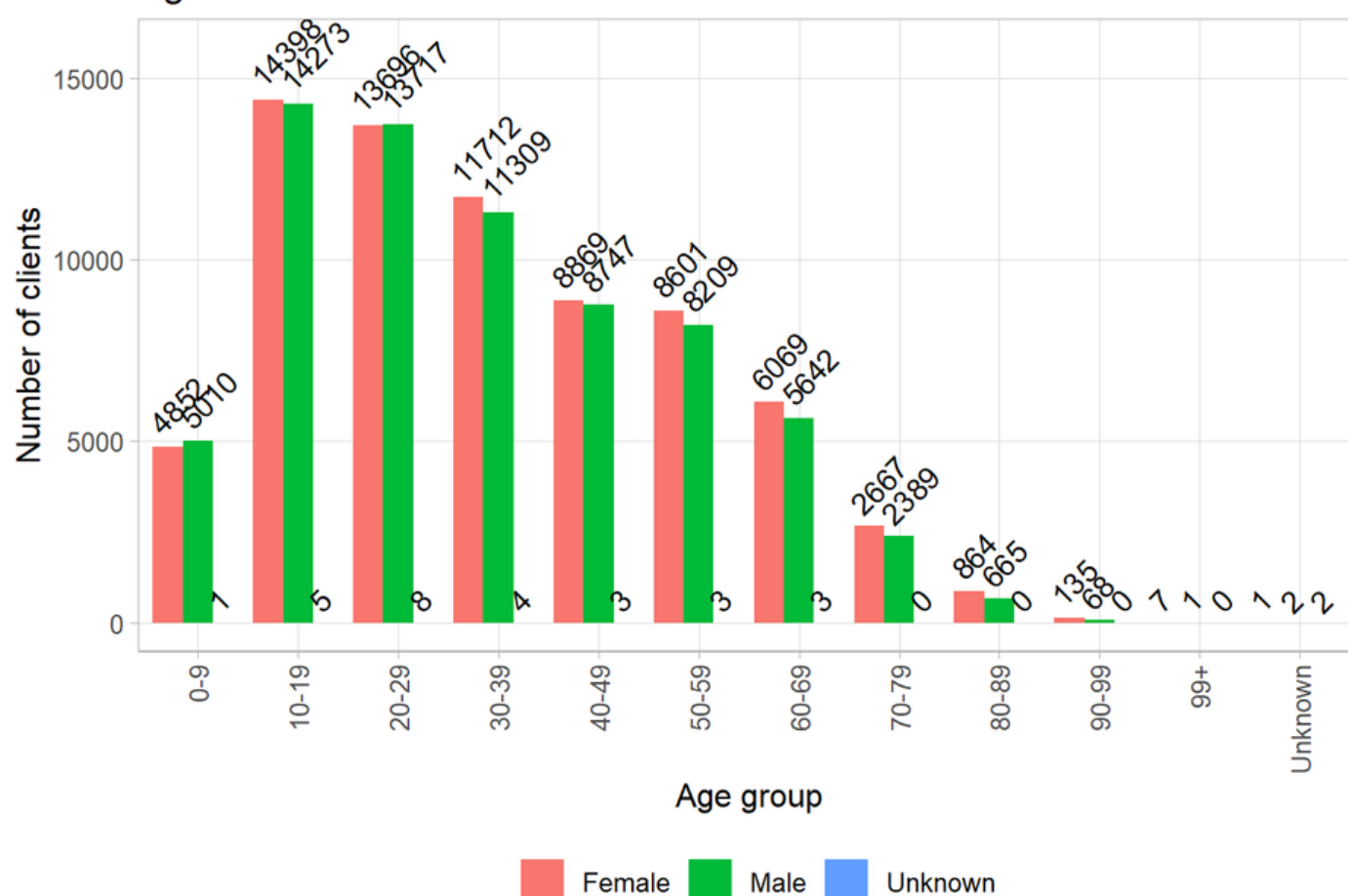
Vaccination curve by dose
