The Manitoba First Nations COVID-19 Pandemic Response Coordination Team advise that, since the October 20, 2022 bulletin, (141) new First Nations COVID-19 cases were identified as of 7:00 am Thursday, November 03, 2022. The total number of lab-confirmed positive and probable positive First Nations cases in Manitoba has increased by 141, taking the total to 40348 cases. Of the total cases, 16014 cases are off-reserve and 24334 cases are on-reserve. The total number of recovered cases are now 39729, there have been 378 deaths, and 56 cases are presumed active.

Please note that only confirmed cases and positive rapid antigen tests collected in certain districts are included.




Details of the 40,348 First Nations cases:


- 10482 people in Winnipeg Regional Health Authority (WRHA)
- 5599 people in the Interlake Eastern Regional Health Authority (IERHA)
- 2718 people in the Southern Health-Santé Sud (SHSS)
- 3794 people in the Prairie Mountain Regional Health Authority (PMH)
- 17755 people in the Northern Regional Health Authority (NRHA)
- 0 where the region is pending.
- The number of recovered cases is 39729.
- The total number of currently hospitalized cases is 61. This is 12% of all hospitalizations in the province currently.
- The number of active hospitalizations is 10. This is 3% of all active hospitalizations in the province.
- The number of First Nations people in the ICU due to COVID-19 is 0. This is NaN% of all COVID-19 ICU admissions currently.
- The number of deaths among First Nations people due to COVID-19 is 378.
- The cases have occurred in 21220 females and 19105 males. 23 are listed as undifferentiated.
- The age range of positive people is 1-93.
- Most cases are in the 10-19 age group (in comparison to 20-29 for other Manitobans.)
- Average time from symptom onset until testing: 3 days (same as the rest of MB.)
- 34% of cases reported the presence of an underlying illness (in comparison to 38% for the rest of MB.)


