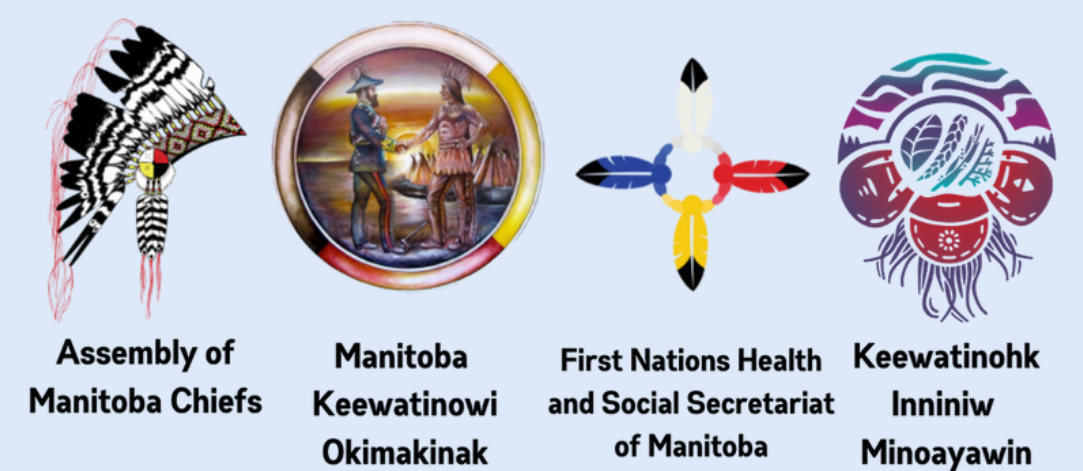


# Manitoba First Nations COVID-19 Pandemic Response Coordination Team

### Date: February 2, 2023

The Manitoba First Nations COVID-19 Pandemic Response Coordination Team advise that, since the January 19, 2023 bulletin, (80) new First Nations COVID-19 cases were identified as of 7:00 am Thursday, February 02, 2023. The total number of lab-confirmed positive and probable positive First Nations cases in Manitoba has increased by 80, taking the total to 41404 cases. Of the total cases, 16445 cases are off-reserve and 24959 cases are on-reserve. The total number of recovered cases are now 40621, there have been 383 deaths, and 14 cases are presumed active.

*Please note that only confirmed cases and positive rapid antigen tests collected in certain districts are included.*

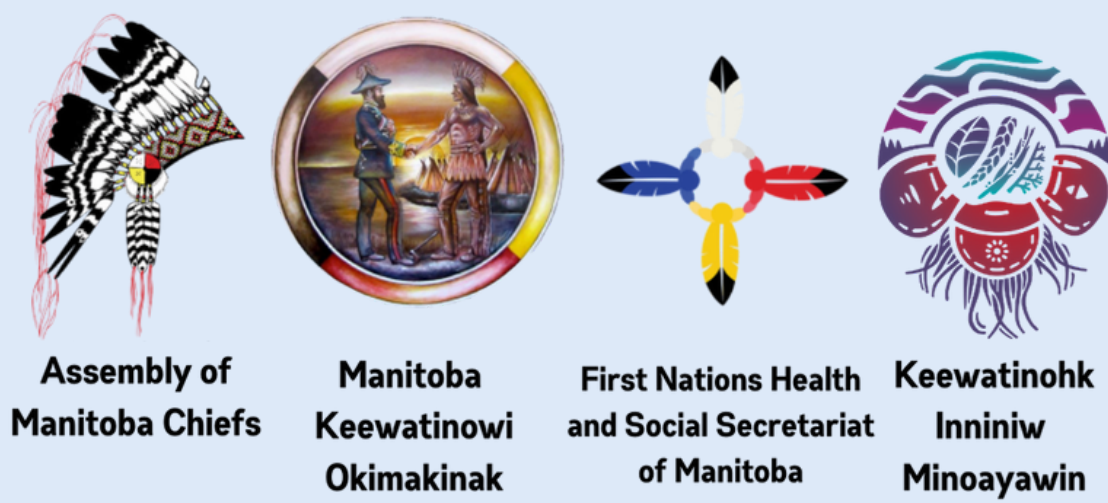

### Details of the 41,404 First Nations cases:

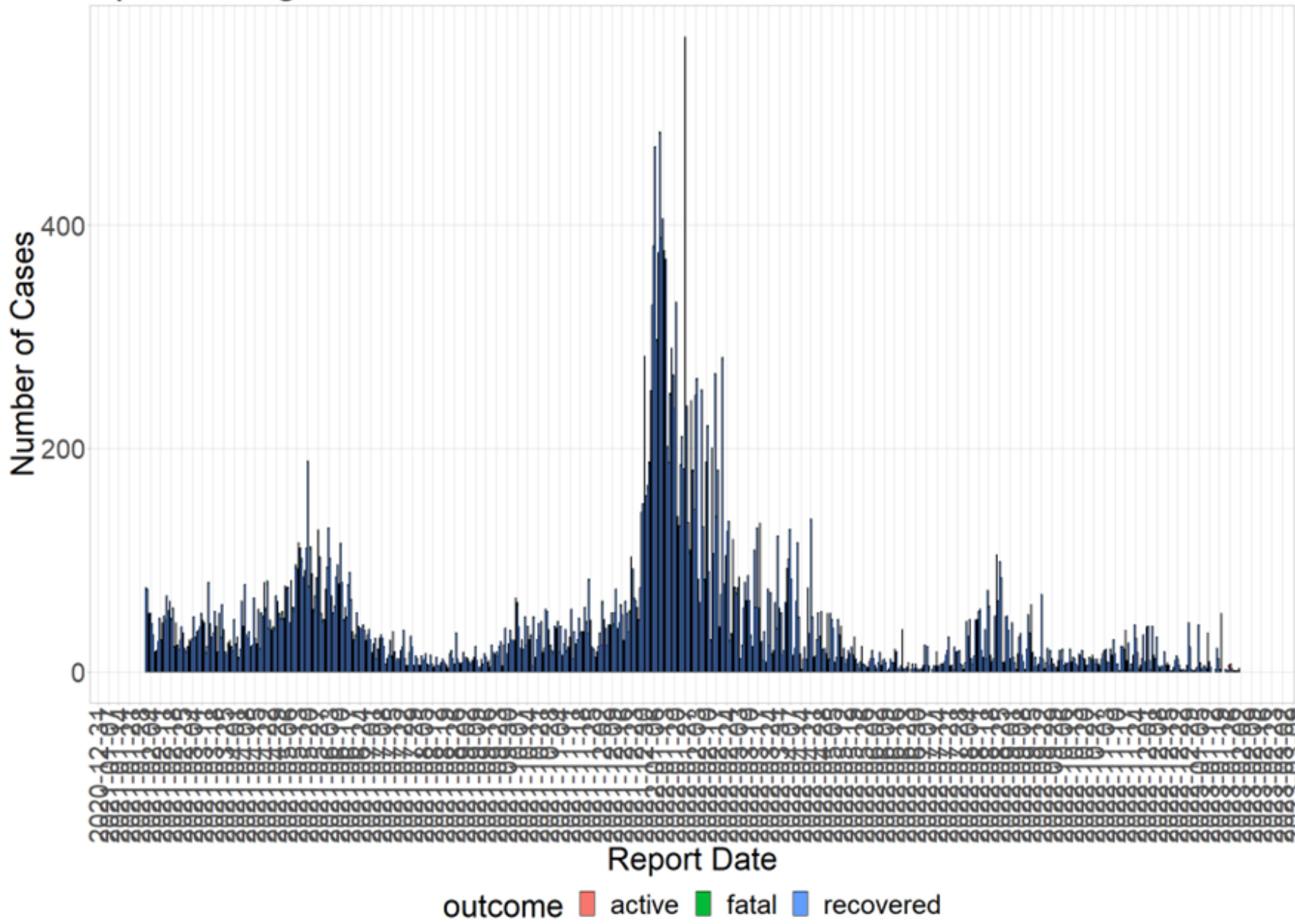
- 10831 people in Winnipeg Regional Health Authority (WRHA)
- 5717 people in the Interlake Eastern Regional Health Authority (IERHA)
- 2815 people in the Southern Health-Santé Sud (SHSS)
- 3871 people in the Prairie Mountain Regional Health Authority (PMH)
- 18170 people in the Northern Regional Health Authority (NRHA)
- 0 where the region is pending.
- The number of recovered cases is 40621.
- The total number of currently hospitalized cases is 35. This is 18% of all hospitalizations in the province currently.
- The number of active hospitalizations is 2. This is 2% of all active hospitalizations in the province.
- The number of First Nations people in the ICU due to COVID-19 is 1. This is 100% of all COVID-19 ICU admissions currently.
- The number of deaths among First Nations people due to COVID-19 is 383.
- The cases have occurred in 21769 females and 19613 males. 22 are listed as undifferentiated.
- The age range of positive people is 1-93.
- Most cases are in the 10-19 age group (in comparison to 20-29 for other Manitobans.)
- Average time from symptom onset until testing: 3 days (same as the rest of MB.)
- 34% of cases reported the presence of an underlying illness (in comparison to 38% for the rest of MB.)



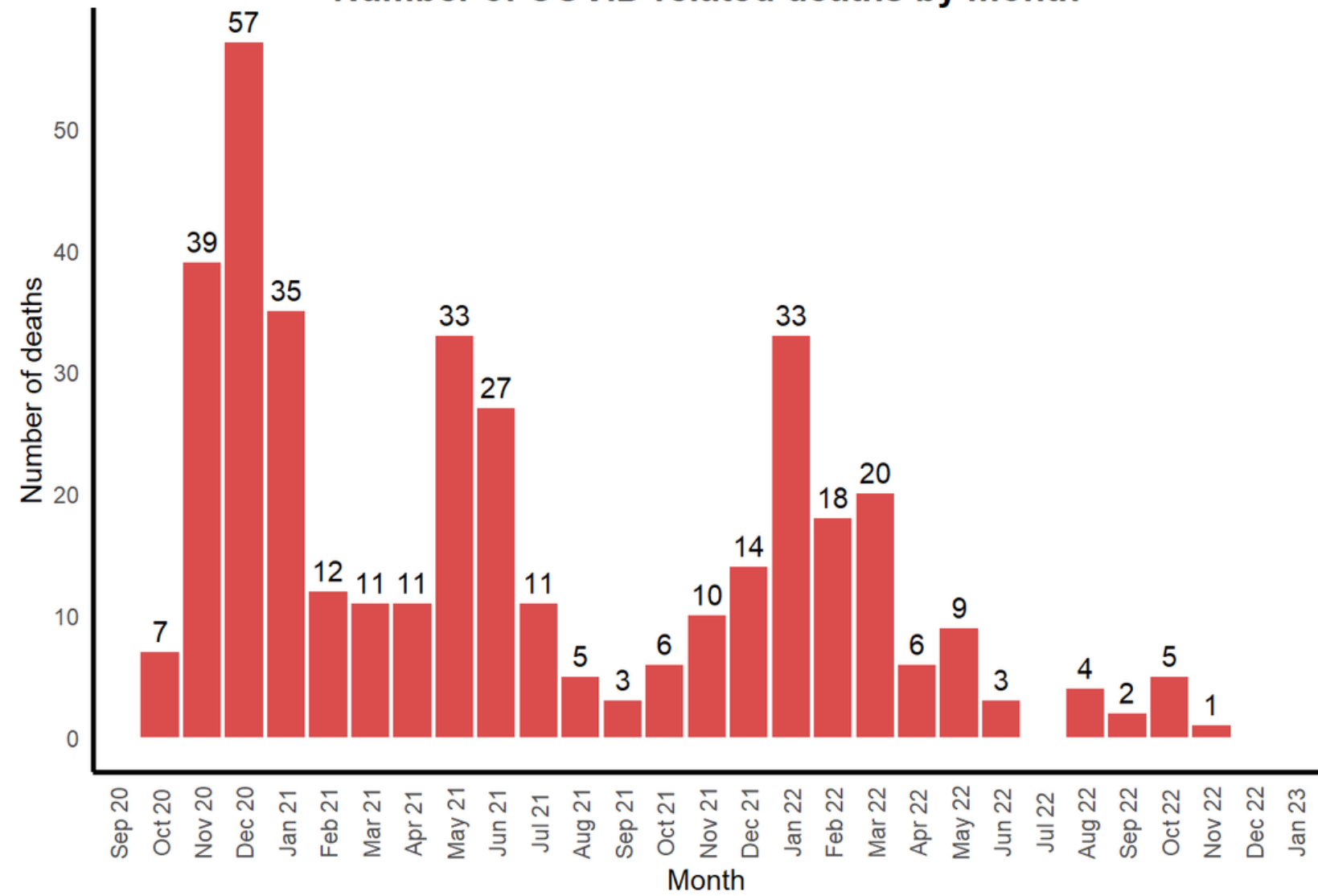

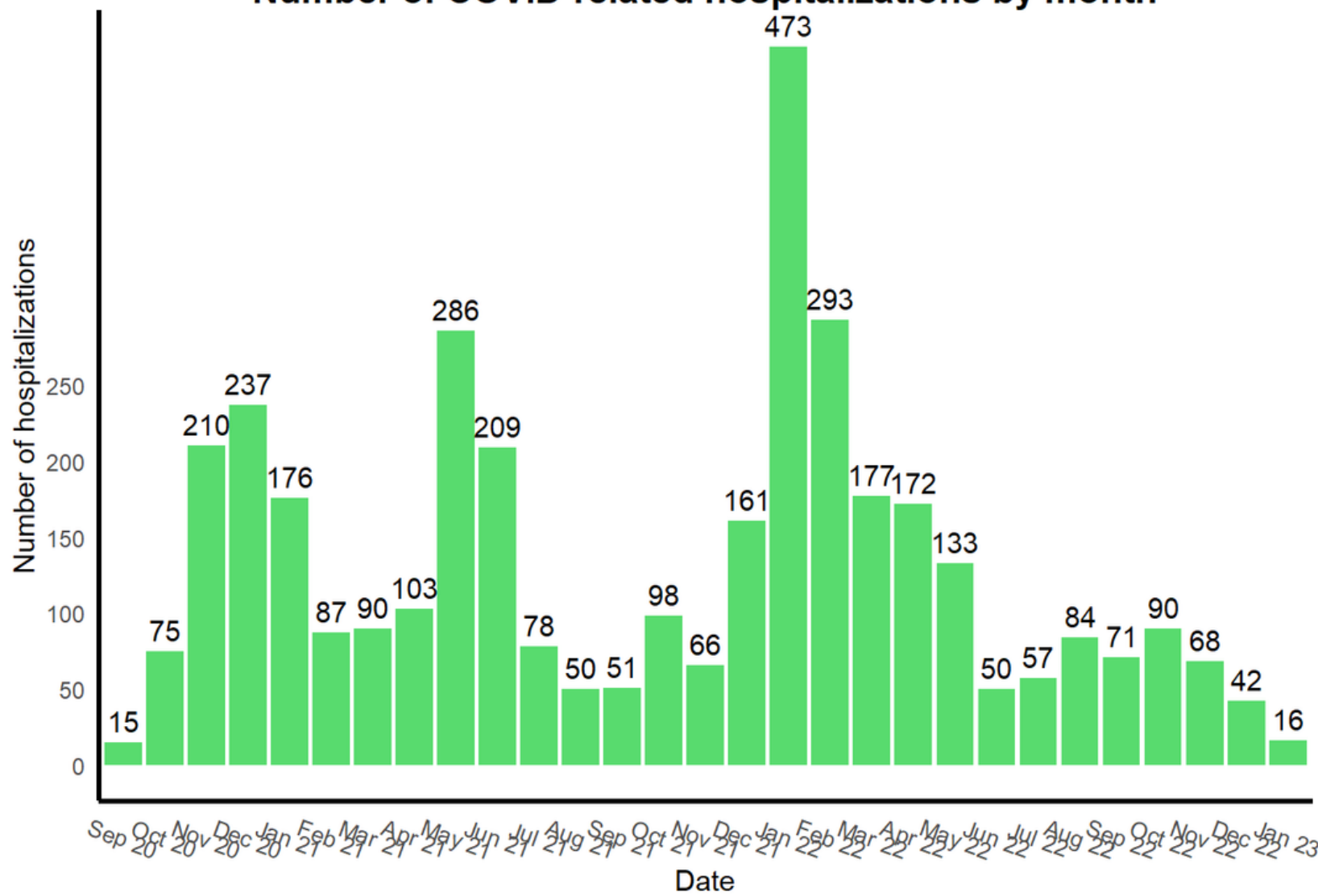
Epidemiologic curve - First Nations cases



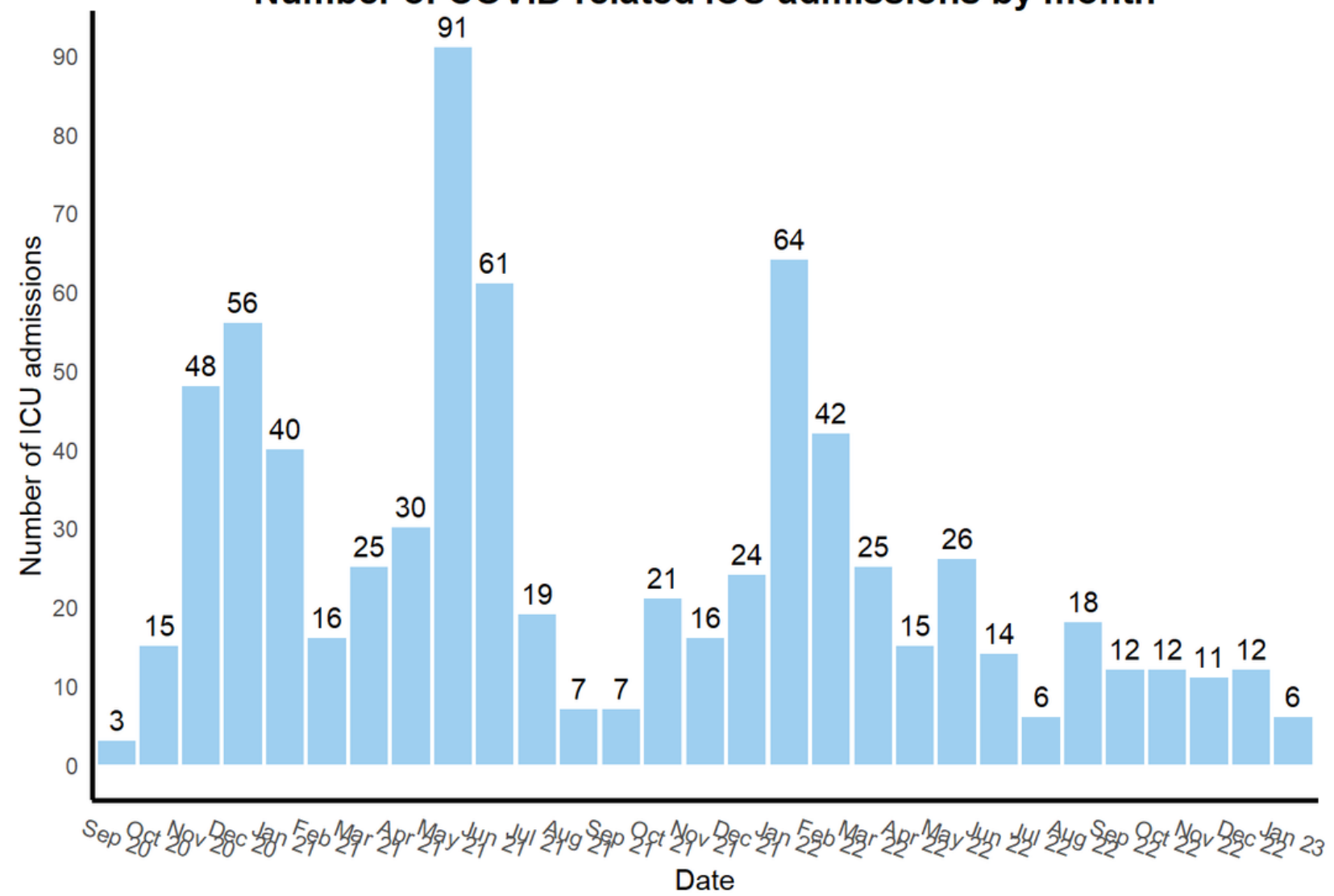
Number of COVID-related deaths by month
